



## INTERNSHIP 2021

The Hong Kong International Photo Festival (HKIPF) was launched in 2010. In each edition, the Festival focuses on a different theme, introducing noteworthy photographers, trends, and movements and discussing manifold issues and perspectives. Through a wide range of public programmes, the Festival bridges Hong Kong and international visual practitioners, creating conversations between people and place, past and present, and oneself and the world.

The Festival is launching an internship programme for those who are interested in a career in the art field. Working closely with the staff members of the Festival, the Intern will participate intensively in the planning, preparation and execution of the Festival exhibitions and events.

Through the Internship, you can expect:

- Gaining insights into the infrastructure and operations of a non-profit art and cultural organisation
- Contributing to community through art
- Meeting people of different backgrounds and disciplines
- Honing practical skills in project management and administration

We welcome all creative inputs - you could be assisting with:

- Exhibition productions and planning
- Editorial and/or translation tasks for catalogue, guidebooks, scripts, captions, etc.
- Research for future projects
- Community and public engagement programmes
- Generating social media content and managing social channels
- Photo and video production
- Marketing campaigns

You will be involved in the following projects / areas:

- Main exhibitions and related activities for HKIPF 2021, featuring publishing house Steidl Verlag, photographers Robert Frank, Orhan Pamuk, Lee Ka Sing and Holly Lee;
- Satellite Exhibitions 2021, making use of public spaces in different districts in Hong Kong, thereby making art accessible to all and connecting different communities and audiences;
- Photobook Showcase, a two-day celebration of photo books published locally and overseas in parallel with various public engagement and family activities; and
- Chuen Lung Community Photography Centre, repurposing a former village primary school to a community-oriented photography infrastructure.



Given the intensity of the internship, we are looking for those who are proactive, observant, self-motivated, meticulous, articulate, open-minded, open to be challenged, friendly, and independent.

The internship is expected to run for 9 months (from Feb to Nov 2021 or from March to Dec 2021), with the intern working at least 2 days per week.

The intern will be given a stipend, amount to be determined by the intern's degree of involvement.
